TOURIST CITY



Despite its tourist appeal, Johns Pass's quiet atmosphere, good food and night time entertainment attracts Tampa natives as well as tourists.

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Located at the South end of the Gulf Beaches in Madeira Beach lies Johns Pass Village. Its angled, tin-roofed buildings and weathered wood boardwalk recall a turn of the century fishing village. A large collection of unique antiques, nature cruises, retail shopping area and restaurants give any passerby an array of entertainment options.
